Pine Cone Regrown: How One Species Thrives After Fire

Elisa Boxer, Kevin and Kristen Howdeshell

High above the forest floor, nestled in the needles of a Lodgepole pine tree, hangs a pine cone. Its seeds are safely protected inside its hardy shell. For forty years, from its perch in the tree the pine cone has borne witness to the growth of the forest and the daily life of its inhabitants.

But now, across the forest a neglected campfire is smoldering. When a spark flies out and catches a leaf, a tree alights. The fire jumps to another tree, and then another, and another. Before long, the forest is ablaze. As the inferno grows, the forest animals flee.

But as it turns out, even in the aftermath of the fire's devastation, the forest can regenerate—thanks, in part, to serotinous species (like the Lodgepole pine) that can only grow anew when the seeds face fire. Poetic text and colorful artwork combine to explain the science behind a forest's renewal and how it is possible to thrive in adversity.

But instead of playing childhood games, Yasi and Mina are confronted with the realities of living in a war-torn city. Iran is at war with the country of Iraq, and bombs are falling on Tehran with increasing frequency. After one bomb blast, Yasi's parents make the decision to leave Tehran and move to America to join other relatives. How can Yasi and Mina's friendship survive the distance?

Against the backdrop of the 1980–88 Iran-Iraq war, two young girls work to keep a friendship alive when adult concerns push them apart.

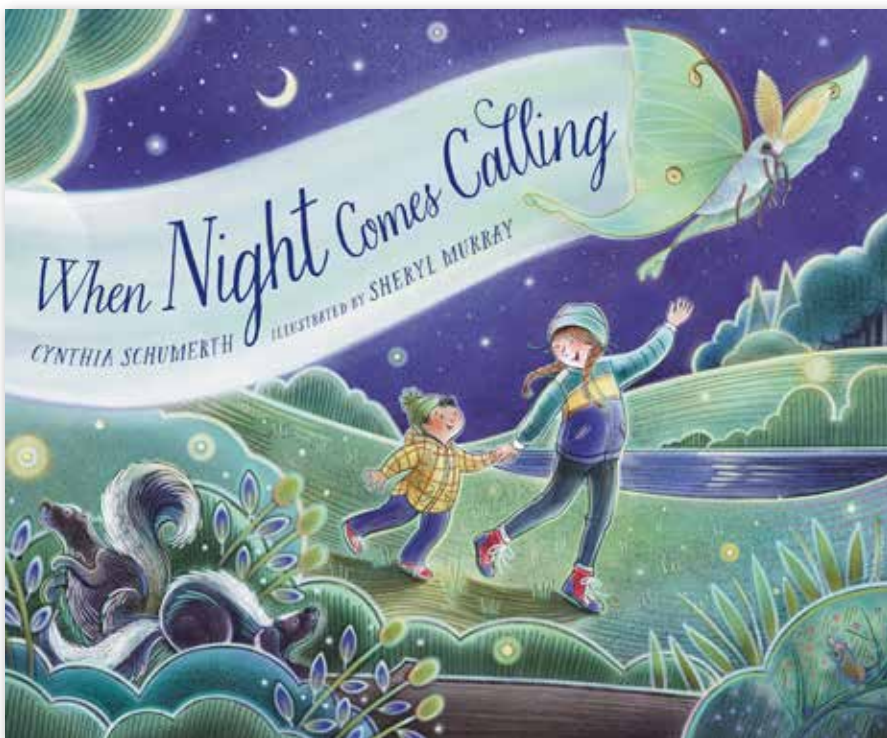

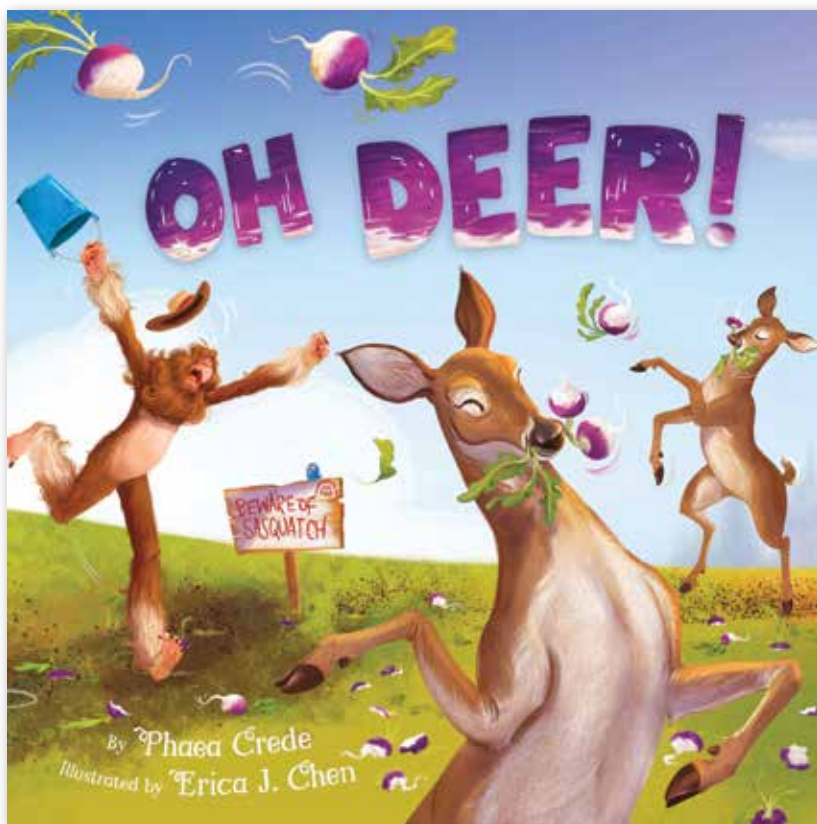

But one morning, just as the turnips are almost ready for harvest . . . disaster! Hungry deer have swooped in to eat Jasper's garden!

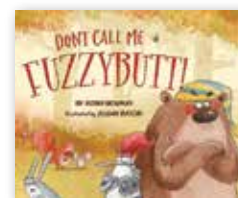

Every year, since they first paired, the couple have returned to the same island. Here they have made a home. As winter makes its way into spring, the pair begins a new year of family life.

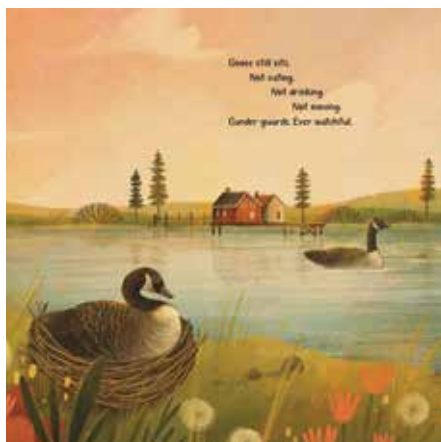
